

The 2025 Missions Conference Flag Ceremony will be held on Sunday, March 9, 2025. Participants will line up in costume (or church clothes) in the children's wing and move up to collect flags in the Ambassador Room, then to the foyer to march in for a roll call of nations early in the morning service. They will then return to gather as a mass "choir" at the front of the auditorium to join in the Mission Conference theme song for this year.

Grace at Work: Redeeming the Grind and the Glory of Your Job by Bryan Chapell (Crossway)

## A Biblical View of Work in Light of the Gospel

For many people, their job is merely "the daily grind" needed to provide for family or pay the bills. Yet our work is a vital means for fulfilling God's purpose for our lives and displaying his grace to those around us. We bear God's image in our workplaces, experiencing his blessings and expressing his nature through our efforts, integrity, creativity, generosity, and excellence. No earthly chore is without the opportunity to observe his divine hand. No challenge in task or relationship is without opportunity to represent God's heart.

Author and pastor Bryan Chapell shares this biblical perspective of vocation, explaining how God gives purpose to our work by making it an instrument of his grace to our own hearts, as well as a way of bringing his goodness and glory into our world. Chapell explains how we can worship God by our work, rising above drudgery, duty, or self-interest with the understanding that our jobs are unique callings for displaying God's character and care. Our work is worship when we see the glory beyond the grind, the mission in the mundane, and the grace at work.

All meetings scheduled for that day will be cancelled unless the meeting can be conducted virtually. Beacon of Hope: All Beacon of Hope programs and food distribution times will be cancelled for the entirety of that day.

**Sunday Services:** If inclement weather develops and the pastors cancel one or all services, go to Church Center App, our website: www.stjohnsfbc.com, or call the church. The church answering machine will have a mesage stating that the services have been cancelled. When you call the church office press '6' to listen to the message.

When there is a weather advisory, there is a good chance we will cancel a service. If you are in doubt, before you leave home, please call the church office and press "6" to listen to the message on the answering machine. We encourage you to use your own judgment whether to travel as the weather may be more severe where you live.

#### **AM Sermon Notes**

Message: By Faith Abel Offered a More Acceptable Sacrifice
Hebrews 11:4Pastor Tim Knaus
Communion

- I. A More Acceptable Sacrifice
  - A. The historical account of Cain and Abel teaches us the importance of obeying God and living for God by faith.

Genesis 4:3-7 (NIV84)

- B. The most important lesson we need to learn from Abel is that he was accepted by God because, by faith, he brought a God-ordained sacrifice.
- C. Abel's brother Cain disobeyed God and tried to worship Him in his own way rather than the way that God had commanded.
- II. Abel Still SpeaksA. The last sentence of verse 4 tells us that Abel still speaks.
- B. As we take Communion this morning, we are coming to God by faith based entirely on the sacrifice of His Son on the cross.

#### Here is how you can accept Christ into your life:

- Admit your need. (I am a sinner)
- Be willing to turn from your sins. (Repent)
- Believe that Jesus Christ died for you on the cross and rose from the grave. (Be saved by faith)
- Through prayer, invite Jesus Christ to control your life through the Holy Spirit. (Receive him as Lord and Savior)

#### We suggest a prayer like this one:

"Dear God, I know I'm a sinner, and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe Jesus Christ is Your Son. I believe that He died for my sin and that you raised Him to life. I want to trust Him as my Savior and follow Him as Lord, from this day forward. Guide my life and help me to do your will. I pray this in the name of Jesus. Amen."
