

Many of these families feel overwhelmed and isolated, which may prevent them from attending church. We can help by providing parents with the chance to participate in services while their children receive care.

Currently, we need one-on-one aides for three autistic children during Jr Church or Sunday school once a month. This support would enable parents to attend our new Sunday School for parents of children with special needs. While we have some volunteers, we need more to ensure adequate assistance and allow current aides to attend services. Volunteers must be 16 or older, regular attendees, complete child protection paperwork, meet with Pastor Dan and parents, and undergo training with Julie Konieczny.

AM Sermon Notes

Message: Jesus is Worthy of More Glory than Moses Hebrews 3:1-6 Pastor Tim Knaus

- I. The Jewish People and Moses
 - A. Moses was esteemed by the Jewish people far above any other Jewish person who ever lived.
 - B. The writer of Hebrews calls Jesus "the apostle and high priest of our confession."
- II. Jesus is Greater Than Moses
 - A. Moses was a faithful servant of the Lord, but Jesus is God Himself and worthy of far greater glory than Moses.
 - B. As we close this morning, I want us to go back to verse 1 and think carefully about the phrase "consider Jesus."

Hebrews 12:1-2 (NIV84)

Here is how you can accept Christ into your life:

- Admit your need. (I am a sinner)
- Be willing to turn from your sins. (Repent)
- Believe that Jesus Christ died for you on the cross and rose from the grave. (*Be saved by faith*)
- Through prayer, invite Jesus Christ to control your life through the Holy Spirit. (*Receive him as Lord and Savior*)

We suggest a prayer like this one:

"Dear God, I know I'm a sinner, and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe Jesus Christ is Your Son. I believe that He died for my sin and that you raised Him to life. I want to trust Him as my Savior and follow Him as Lord, from this day forward. Guide my life and help me to do your will. I pray this in the name of Jesus. Amen."
