Beginning of the Year Check-In Questions for Christians

Don't leave your spiritual growth up to spontaneity. Make a plan. Now that we're in 2018, here are some questions to ask as you formulate ways to grow.



In no particular order:

1. Am I going to make regular devotions with the Lord a priority and remove all obstacles that prevent me from doing so?

2. Unless there is an emergency, am I committed to attending church every single Sunday to hear the preaching of God's Word, serve the saints, and partake of the Lord's supper?

3. Am I going to preach the gospel to myself and remind myself of the grace that is available to me through Christ?

4. Am I going to confess and repent of my sins quickly?

5. Am I going to live deeply in Christian community and seek to bear the burdens of others?

6. Am I going to regularly share the gospel with nonbelievers in hopes of persuading them to repent and trust and Christ?

7. Am I going to steward my time, talent, and treasure to the glory of God and for the sake of the church?

8. Will this be the year that I seek to find a spiritual mentor?

9. Am I going to not only be discipled by others, but seek to disciple others?

10. Will I trust God's providence if things don't go how I want them to?

Some of these will apply to you; some of them won't. For example, you may already have a spiritual mentor or perhaps because of this season of life, you may not have the capacity or energy to disciple anyone. That's fine. These questions are provided not to make you feel guilty, but to provide some guidance and identify potential areas of spiritual growth.

If you are in doubt, before you leave home, please call the church office and press "6" to listen to the message on the answering machine. We encourage you to use your own judgment whether to travel as the weather may be more severe where you live.

Could YOU survive in Poverty?

On Saturday, February 9th, from 9am-12 noon, First Baptist Church has the unique opportunity to host a **Poverty Simulation**. This learning tool has been created to help people understand the realities of poverty. During the simulation, participants role-play the lives of low-income families. Some are recipients of temporary assistance from the Department of Health and Human Services, some are disabled, some are homeless, some are children, and some are senior citizens on Social Security.

Participants have the stressful task of providing for daily necessities and shelter on a limited budget for four 15-minute "weeks," during which they interact with human service agencies, grocers, payday lenders, bill collectors, job interviewers, police officers, and others.

Once you participate in this simulation, you will not look those who struggle with poverty in the same way. And you will be challenged to consider how you can make a difference in our community.

It was in a Guest Home in New York City that three young ladies (Carolyn Hovingh, Joan Peckinpaugh and Eleanor Van Houten), en route to Liberia, West Africa, were staying. They were waiting for their ship to arrive. On Sunday morning the grey haired hostess told them they needed to come right back after the evening church service. She had three young men she wanted them to meet. Two men were Bible School students who lived there and the other man was visiting them. The third man turned out to be the Second Officer of the ship the ladies were waiting for! On the following Thursday they boarded the British ship "Freetown" and Stan came down to help them up the gangway. He was very helpful on the journey since they had never sailed on a ship before. Well, on the 16th day of the voyage, Stan and Eleanor were engaged! Eleanor says that she made Stan wait 24 hours for an answer because she didn't want to "rush" things!

From the day they met until they said goodbye in Monrovia, Liberia, was three weeks, and then it was three YEARS before they saw each other again. You can imagine what Eleanor's senior missionaries thought of her! She never said much because she knew if she was on the outside looking in she would agree that it was an impossible situation.

So, Eleanor was in the jungles of Liberia for three years, while Stan finished two years of his contract at sea, and then went from England to Grand Rapids, Michigan to Baptist Bible Institute. He met her family and friends and waited for Eleanor to come home. She arrived back in the USA December 23, 1952, and they were married January 9, 1953. All their friends decided by now "it was going to work." The Lord gave them 50 years serving Him together and took Stan to Heaven the day after their 50th wedding anniversary, 53 years after the day they first met.

Just an aside: Eleanor noted a trend for a few years of single ladies traveling to Liberia by ship rather than flying! True story! Eleanor served with Baptist Mid-Missions in Liberia 23 years. Stan and Eleanor's main ministry was church planting, teaching in Bible Schools, and medical (Eleanor is an LPN). They also served in New Zealand for six months, Hawaii for a year, and England for 17 years. They "retired" to California in 1992 to be close to their children.

Eleanor moved from Quaker Gardens the end of January, 2014, to live with youngest son Steve, Robyn and family. They all made her welcome and have taken excellent care of her. In February, 2014, while visiting friends at Quaker Gardens, she fell and broke her left hip. She is now back to using a walker in the house, but still uses a wheelchair outdoors. Eleanor can do more and more things for herself, but still requires (and enjoys) lots of TLC! Robyn teaches 3rd grade, and Eleanor helps her do various projects, plus goes to school every Thursday afternoon to listen to the students read. The kids call her "Grandma Brittain" and they all have a mutual admiration for each other.

"Silver Foxes", a ministry for widows by widows from her church, meets once per month, and Eleanor does the devotions. She also ministers to the most important people...her kids and grandkids!

Contact with "Fruits" from around the world keep Eleanor in-touch and prayerful:

Liberia — From her first term in Liberia, Eleanor has a very special "Liberian daughter", Hannah, a mother of six who now lives in Kansas City, Missouri. Hannah picked Eleanor for her "Ma" in Tappi Town, when she was an eight year old "mission girl" in 1951! She still loves and serves the Lord as does her family. Also, Nathan Dolo, her Liberia "son", came to work for them in Monrovia, and mainly looked after Stevie as a toddler. Nathan still follows the Lord and lives in New Jersey now. One of his sons, Deawaika, lives with his wife in San Diego, CA.

Hawaii and England — Hawaii is where Stan and Eleanor first met Steve and Linda Erickson. They were already saved when Stan and Eleanor met them, and they came to church and Bible studies. Steve was a pilot in the U.S. Air Force, and was stationed in England shortly after the Brittains moved there. They enjoyed continued fellowship there in England, and later in Washington D.C., when Steve was stationed there. Now retired, the Ericksons faithfully support Eleanor each month today. They serve in their local church in Arkansas.

England — Stuart and Anna, with whom Stan and Eleanor played match-maker both to Jesus and to each other, and Stan eventually married, serve with their beautiful children, in London. Stuart is the pastor of Trinity Chapel. Stuart has visited Eleanor on a couple of trips to California, and Anna and the kids were able to join him in 2008. God is good, all the time! Or, as Stuart would say in his spry, crisp English accent, "Brilliant!"

Advice to the youth from Eleanor, "Serve the Lord as a missionary — the blessings you receive are simply unbelievable and everlasting!"

Sheila was born into a close family in Washington DC with a grandfather who was a Methodist Pastor. She, along with her two older sisters and parents, faithfully attended church. She thought herself a Christian until she attended a Baptist Church and realized there was more to being a Christian. While her family watched Billy Graham on TV she realized she had not accepted Christ. She went into her room and accepted his gift of salvation. After that, she could not get enough of God's Word and told everyone she would like to be a medical missionary. She began attending a Baptist Church with friends and met Claggett (his father was the pastor). Her mother began to attend with her and both were baptized when Sheila was around 14 years old.

Claggett was born in Washington, D.C. He was one of three children, and his father was a Baptist Pastor. His father was well respected, and the children did what was expected of them. Claggett accepted the Lord as a child but really came to know what it meant to be saved as an adult.

Sheila and Claggett sang in choir together, were in the same Sunday school class, and attended the same school (he graduated two years ahead of Sheila). Claggett then went into the military and Sheila attended three years of Nursing School. She went to Norfolk, VA to be with Claggett and they were married in August of 1966. Four months later, Claggett was shipped to Vietnam. Sheila returned home to continue her degree, graduating with a diploma in Nursing (RN).

After Claggett's return from the military, they worked in their local church (Emmanuel Baptist) with the young people. The Lord then directed them to Elohim Bible Institute in N.Y. where they received a very practical education and participated in many outreaches. They both received a diploma in Bible Education. They felt restless and thought of overseas missions. They applied to, and were accepted by, Overseas Mission Fellowship where they went through candidate school. Claggett continued his education at Cornerstone College (GRBC) and received a bachelor's degree in Christian Education.

Their ministry is church planting. There are several Black churches in Lansing, but most are very liberal in their faith. They saw a great need for a fundamental Baptist church. They began meeting with a few people in their home on Thursdays for Bible study and then began meeting in Berean Baptist Church. This has grown into what is now Grace Bible Baptist Fellowship. In January of 2001, they began renovations on a property and building at 635 Armstrong Rd. in Lansing. They held their first service March 4, and a dedication service on Sunday, June 3, 2001. On March 29, 2008, Grace Bible Baptist Fellowship graduated from church plant to church status.

The members of Berean Baptist Church offered their building to them in August 2013. This took place because Berean Baptist was dissolving as a church. They had their first service on Sunday, Oct. 6, 2013, at their new location (6121 S. Waverly Road, Lansing, MI 48911). In 2014, approximately twelve of the former members of Berean Baptist became members of Grace Bible Baptist. They have a very unique and joyous relationship. It is truly God honoring. Pastor Claggett and Sheila are now retired. They continue to reach out to the community and introduce their neighbors to Christ.

Peggy was born and raised in Flint, Michigan. Her mom and dad were not believers. She was not looking for the Lord but believes He found her. At age 17, she went to church with a friend, heard about salvation, and came to know Jesus.

Dick was also raised in a home without the Lord in Grand Blanc, Michigan. He was saved at a church meeting at age14 in an Evangelical Brethren church.

Dick and Peggy met at church and started dating at age 18. When they adopted Janet, they were led to Bethany Baptist in Grand Blanc. They took membership classes, were baptized, and became involved in God's work around the age of 30. They worked with the youth, choir, and taught Sunday School classes. Dick was a deacon and on the Board. They were called into missions at a missionary conference in 1963.

Dick and Peggy graduated from Pillsbury Baptist College in Minnesota in 1966. They were on deputation for 19 months and then began work on their first church plant in Alaska. Over the course of their career, Dick and Peggy helped plant three Alaskan churches in Anchor Point, Kodiak, and Palmer. They retired from full-time ministry in 1996.

Although Peggy and Dick had retired, they kept very busy with their church. Peggy used her artistic skills for flower arranging and decorating at the church. She also created decorations and visual aids for ladies' retreats and VBS.

Dick spent a good deal of time in the warmer weather fishing for salmon, hunting caribou, and processing the meat to freeze for winter supply. He also filled the pulpit when other pastors were on vacation.

Dick is now with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. He went home to be with the Lord September 3, 2014. After nearly 64 years of marriage, Peggy praises the Lord for the many years He gave them. Dick was a wonderful preacher, pastor, missionary, witness, husband and father. Praise God for their life serving the Lord together in Alaska for a total of 46 years. Peggy still attends Pioneer Peak Baptist Church (the church they founded in 1975).
