

### 25 Bible Reading Tips

Looking for some Bible reading tips? Below you can find 25 of them.



In no particular order:

- 1. Use a Bible reading plan. Here's some to <u>check out</u>.
- 2. Read your Bible even when you don't feel like it.
- 3. Don't get down on yourself if you skip a devotional time.
- 4. Read your Bible with others to learn more in community.
- 5. Don't skip devotional Bible reading for Christian books.
- 6. Use a commentary. Check out this post on how to find the <u>best</u> <u>commentaries</u>.
- 7. Ask a godly mentor about his or her Bible reading methods.

8. The best way to increase your faith in the Bible is not by reading books about the Bible, but by actually reading the Bible. So read it.

9. Don't avoid the Old Testament

there.

10. Don't avoid Revelation — it's more encouraging than you think.

11. Use a study Bible. I like the <u>ESV Study Bible</u>.

12. Use a Bible reading app.

13. Use your best energy for your Bible reading time.

14. Don't mistake a desire to read the Bible for actually reading the Bible. Desire is great, but it doesn't mean much if it doesn't lead to action.

15. That said, struggle with desire? Pray and ask God for help.

16. If you've struggled with Bible reading in 2017, don't wait until 2018 to start reading. Start today.

17. Meditate on what you read after you read it.

18. Learn from <u>Andy Naselli</u>: listen to your Bible, read one book in one sitting, and read without any chapter or verse references.

19. Pick one book of the Bible and read it over, and over, and over again. You'll be surprised how much more you see in one book when you read it 10 times as opposed to once.

20. Pray before, during, and after you read. Pray for <u>these things</u>.

21. Don't become self-righteous because of your Bible knowledge. Your Bible tells you that your Bible knowledge shouldn't make you self-righteous, but grateful, loving, and humble.

22. Share what you learn about the Bible with others.

23. Read what Augustine, Calvin, Spurgeon, and other dead guys said about the Bible in the past to inspire you in the present.

24. Be sure to practice good interpretation methods to avoid misunderstanding.

25. Never stop reading. As Charles Spurgeon once said, "Nobody ever outgrows Scripture; the Book widens and deepens with our years."

#### Local Evangelism Follow Up Ideas

Sometimes we spend the month of October thinking about the topic of evangelism, but fail to actually make any changes to our daily behavior. We all do it... I think its part of our fallen, human nature. Here is a list of ideas that are achievable without making any dramatic changes to our schedules and lives; yet they could have a dramatic impact on the eternal lives of our friends, neighbors, loved ones and community. Don't be overwhelmed trying to apply EVERY one of these ideas to your life... Pick one and start there! As it becomes a habit, part of your normal routine and flow of life, perhaps you can add something else in the future. We'd love to hear about your success stories! And we'd be glad to laugh together if you have a colossal failure! Because remember, ultimately, it's a God thing when people come to Christ!

• Take time to share a gospel story with your own children or grandkids, our church library has a great selection!

Give appropriate tracts to friends, family members, and co-workers. Pray about what tract might reach a specific person.

- Pray that God would give you opportunities to share you faith today and then be on the lookout for Him to answer that prayer.
- Review your personal testimony about how you came to Christ Don't be afraid to share your testimony. Consider joining the church and sharing yours publicly if you haven't yet!
- Commit to mastering a gospel presentation by the end of next month. PRACTICE!
- Find an appropriate way today to let someone know you are a Christian.
- Talk about Christian ideas in a book, movie, or music in daily situations. Or something you're learning at church/small group/etc.
- Share a link to a great sermon that you've hear recently to your Facebook or twitter feed.
- Notice the 1st time visitors in church this week. Say hello. Make a step to get to know them.
- Find a place to serve in the community so that you are in regular contact with unchurched people.
- Send a note of encouragement to someone; perhaps a single mom and remind her of God's love and provision or someone who recently lost a loved one.
- Pray for all the people on your street to know Jesus Christ as their Savior. Use google satellite to make a prayer map!
- Then... When was the last time you visited your neighbor? Make it a point to do so again soon. If an opportunity arises, talk to them about church and invite them to come next Sunday.


#### CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY FOR FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

At our deacons meeting on August 15th, 2013 the pastors/elders and deacons voted to approve a new Conflict of Interest Policy. While the new policy will, over the years, only apply to a few people in our congregation, it is a model policy that has been highly recommended by Christian legal associations and other churches. It ensures that every matter of church business is conducted in an above board manner with no appearance of any unethical behavior.

A conflict of interest occurs when someone in church leadership or their family member(s) appear to gain an unfair advantage in the way that the church business is conducted. For example, let's suppose that one of the deacons has a son whose business is roofing and siding, and he has placed a bid on a roofing and siding job the church is having done. If it is the deacons' responsibility to award the project the deacon whose son has placed the bid should voluntarily remove himself from all discussions about the awarding of the bid and especially from the final vote. His inclusion in the discussions or final vote could appear to be a conflict of interest. The removal of the deacon from the discussion and vote will be duly noted in the official deacon minutes.

Another example: let's suppose that one of the pastors, elders, deacons, or missions committee members has a son or daughter who is heading to the mission field and is being considered for financial support from our church. The pastor, elder, deacon, or missions committee member in question should voluntarily remove himself/herself from all discussions and subsequent votes on their son or daughter. That would include the missions committee meetings, deacons meetings, and the final congregational vote. Again, the voluntary removal of the person will be noted in the missions committee meeting minutes and the deacons meeting minutes.

If you would like a copy of the formal policy you can obtain one from the church office. Also, a book on this subject that is highly recommended by the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches is *Doing Right While Doing Good* by Kevin Vanderground and Kenneth Bickel.

Becky grew up in northern Minnesota in a Christian family. She became a Christian at age seven while her mom was reading her a missionary story. She used her gifts in music in the mission church they were a part of and was baptized there. She attended one year at Bethel College in St. Paul, then transferred to Bob Jones University, where she met Glenn.

Glenn's parents were not Christians when they married near Jackson, Michigan. When they moved to New Jersey, they started attending a Presbyterian church and six months later put their faith in Christ. Glenn received the Lord at age three. After Glenn's junior year of high school, he told the Lord he would be willing to do with his life whatever the Lord wanted. He majored in music, minored in German, and also studied Greek.

After Glenn and Becky married, Glenn pastored in Spartanburg and Simpsonville, South Carolina. In 1978 they moved to Wisconsin where Glenn received a master's degree in Hebrew & Semitic Studies at the University of Wisconsin. They both were committed to missions in their younger years; however, the Lord continued to say "not now." After 17 years of marriage they moved to Michigan, where God called them to missionary service with Bibles International. Bible translation has been their vision and desire and what they have prepared for since their teen years. They have just completed their 23rd year with Bibles International (BI).

Becky has been part of BI's stewardship department. Because of severe problems in their daughter's family, Becky and Glenn assumed custody of two of their grandchildren in April 2017, Micaiah and Jase Piland. Micaiah is 4 and Jase is almost 3. As a result of this, Becky's involvement with BI has been curtailed greatly, but she still travels with Glenn whenever time and money allow.

Glenn's work includes producing tools to use in translation work, helping translators, and helping those checking translations. BI has many projects going on throughout the world. Glenn is involved in the professional development of each consultant, making sure they have the tools they need to do their job, as well as appropriate computer and software training.

Glenn works with several translation teams each year. Each verse that the translators have translated is checked against the original Greek or Hebrew. This involves lots of travel to distant places, mostly in French-speaking Africa but also to countries in Asia, South America, and even Europe. Bibles International has been blessed to publish New Testaments and complete Bibles for many people groups and is constantly taking on new projects once others are inished.

Carl was born in St. Johns and grew up on a farm near Perrinton, MI with his parents, Stan and Helen Kresge, and his 7 brothers and sisters. He was saved as a young child, strongly influenced by their family's Bible reading times and prayer before bedtime. Carl met Lori at First Baptist in St. Johns in the junior high youth group. Neither of them dated anyone else; after 4 years of dating they were married, between Carl's junior and senior year of college.

Lori was born in Carson City, MI to parents Willard and Marilyn Goldman and grew up in St. Johns. She has one brother. She was taken to church from birth, but at a communion service when she was 5, she wasn't allowed to participate and wanted to know why. She was told she needed to be saved first, and her mom led her to the Lord at age 5. She was baptized at First Baptist in St. Johns when she was 8 or 9. She was active in the youth group and benefited greatly from the teaching and preaching she heard. Ministry in music was also a big part of her spiritual growth.

Carl graduated from Fulton High School, and then from Cornerstone University with a B.A. in religion and a minor in speech, and later from Grand Rapids Theological Seminary with an M.Div. in Christian Education. Carl assisted in the ministry at First Baptist in St. Johns for a year and was associate pastor at North Park Baptist Church in Grand Rapids, MI for 10 years, assuming that would be his life work.

In 1991, a missionary speaker challenged their church to raise money for a church building in the former Soviet Union. That began a sister-church relationship with a congregation in Zaparozhye, Ukraine, which led to an invitation to send a team to help with construction. Carl was asked to lead that group headed for Zaparozhye. Later that year, SEND International asked him to lead another church, First Baptist of St. Johns, on a missions trip to their sister church in Klintsi, Russia, which he did in 1994.

In the spring of 1994, Carl attended a Moody Pastors' Conference. One of the speakers, Bruce Wilkinson, began his message with, "I'm here to talk some of you pastors into moving to Russia for a year." That began a process of wrestling with God and wondering if He would want that for his family. Later that year he resigned his position at North Park and Carl and Lori moved with their three daughters (ages 14, 12, and 9) to Khabarovsk for a one-year assignment with SEND International, teaching at a Bible college and helping administratively with SEND's new team in Far East Russia. When they returned to Michigan in December 1995, Carl anticipated stepping back into pastoral ministry, and was seriously considering serving as assistant pastor here at First Baptist. However, SEND asked him to serve as Director for HarvesTime Response, a five-year program from 1996-2000, mobilizing resources for Russia and Ukraine. Carl and Lori joined SEND, and he took the position. In 1999 Carl became Deputy Regional Director for Eurasia, and shortly thereafter Eurasia Regional Director.

Carl's major responsibility is overseeing SEND's work in Russia, Ukraine and Kazakhstan. He works closely with field leadership in developing leadership, setting and implementing vision, ensuring that effective membership care is taking place, and addressing challenges on the field. He works out of his home in Grand Rapids, travels to the International Office in Farmington periodically, and travels to Russia, Ukraine and Kazakhstan several times each year. Lori serves SEND on the Women's Ministry Team and spends significant time teaching, encouraging Eurasia missionary women, and serving in music ministry. They continue involvement at North Park Baptist Church. God has blessed them with three daughters and sons-in-law, plus 11 grandchildren.
