The Blessing of the Gift of Prayer

Lately, I've been thinking about the benefits of being a Christian. There are so many that I hardly know where to start. I can easily write about the gifts of justification, sanctification, or adoption (and many others similar to it). But in this post, I want to keep it simple. I want to focus on a blessing that we may sometimes overlook — the blessing of the gift of prayer.



Isn't it amazing that the God of the Bible allows his people to communicate with him through prayer?

I think sometimes we take for granted this access we have to God. But if you pause and think about the various dimensions of prayer and just how beneficial this access to God is, it will bless your soul.

The Blessing of the Gift of Prayer

When I think about prayer being a blessing, here are some things that come to mind:

We have 24/7 access to God.

There have been times when I couldn't fall asleep because I felt restless. During these times, it's almost impossible to cast your burdens on anyone else since they are likely asleep. And yet, even in the middle of the night when everyone else is unavailable, God is up, ready and willing to hear your prayer.

This is amazing. You might have close family, friends, mentors, and other such relationships where people are helpful to you in many ways. But they cannot *always* be there for you because they are not *always* available. But God is incessantly accessible.

The Lord doesn't need sleep. He's always awake. You can always go to him — at 2:00 am when your screaming baby can't sleep, at 6:30 am when you're anxious and scared about facing the day, at noon when the day isn't going how you planned. This 24/7, 365 access to God we have in prayer is truly astounding.

We don't need to use physical words when we pray.

I once led a small group with someone. I told this person I was praying for our group at work, to which the response I received was something like, "God loves cubicles prayers, too!" It's true: because God is omniscient (all-knowing), he can understand what you pray in your mind with 100% accuracy, every single time. Yes, using words and praying out loud is essential. Soundless prayers should not summarize the entirety of our prayer lives. But sometimes words aren't possible, and God gets your thoughts.

We don't need to always pray long-winded prayers.

I love this exchange between the King and Nehemiah.

The King asks: "What are you requesting?" (<u>Nehemiah 2:4a</u>). And this is the little line I love: "So I prayed to the God of heaven" (<u>Nehemiah 2:4b</u>). And then Nehemiah tells the king what he wants.

The footnote from my <u>ESV Study Bible</u> says: "Nehemiah had prayed a great deal, of course (<u>Neh. 1:4</u>), but here he quickly speaks to God (probably silently) before he answers the King."

I'm not knocking long-winded prayers. I love praying extensively, and I find <u>my prayer times</u> with the Lord to be some of the best parts of my day. But there is a time and place for everything, which means sometimes your prayers should be long-winded and other times they simply will not. Sometimes, you can just say a quick prayer, move forward, and trust God with the results.

I heard a story of a Christian leader who was on a panel discussing a tough cultural topic. He was asked a hard question and didn't know how to respond. He knocked his pen from the table to buy himself time to pray quickly and silently in his mind as he picked up his pen. He said after he prayed and picked up his pen, he felt as if the Lord gave him a response.

Who am I to doubt him? I believe these sorts of little prayers throughout the day are powerful.

Prayer changes things.

John Piper says: "Prayer causes things to happen that would not happen if you did not pray."

As it's been said before, God ordains all *ends* (the end result of everything that happens), but he also ordains the *means* to every end (the things that he uses to make the ends happen), and he sometimes uses your prayers to accomplish the ends.

I bring this up because it's not talked about enough. Too often we treat prayer as something we should do only to sustain us, to give thanks, and to ask for general things. These things are good — very good. But don't forget that God is a Father and you are his child. And as his child, you are free to pray prayers with particular specificity for things that you want to see happen. Pray big, bold, specific, prayers.

Prayer changes you.

Back to the previous one: prayer can change things. But sometimes it doesn't. Why? It could be for <u>a number of reasons</u>. But it's usually because your prayer does not align with God's will. But that's a good thing because God knows better.

And yet, we must recognize that while prayer does not always change your *circumstances*, prayer often changes *you*. The Lord meets with you when you pray. He sanctifies you. He changes your character and provides what you need to get through your situation, even if he does not give you exactly what you want.

We can go to other Christians for prayer.

When we take prayer requests at church or after small groups or after that one-on-one coffee meeting, we are not playing games. We're not just going through motions. We're not just saying Christian stuff just to be saying it. No, we ask for prayer requests because we know our God answers prayer. It is such a privilege to belong to a group of people — namely, the church — where we know we can have other brothers and sisters pray for us.

There are many aspects to prayer which are a blessing. Often, we take it for granted. But when we reflect on the many ways in which prayer is a blessing, it will help us appreciate this great gift from God.

"BY THE WAY, WHAT IS OUR POLICY ON....." Couples Who Desire to Have Their Wedding at First Baptist Church

It is very important that couples contemplating marriage be familiar with these guidelines:

A couple needs to meet the following five requirements before we will agree to conduct the wedding and/ or let them use our church building for the wedding:

- 1. Both the bride and groom must know Christ as their personal Lord and Savior.
- 2. Either the bride or groom must be a regular attendee of First Baptist Church. (If the bride and groom are both Christians, but do not attend our church, we will consider conducting the wedding if they agree to faithfully attend our church for at least a six month period of time.)
- 3. If a wedding is held at First Baptist there can be no dancing or alcohol at the reception, even if the reception is held off-site.
- 4. Both the bride and groom must agree to meet with one of our Pastors before approval for use of the church is given.
- 5. The pastors of First Baptist do not perform remarriage ceremonies following a divorce.*

*The pastors do believe there are some biblical grounds for remarriage following divorce. They simply have chosen not to participate in the often complex process of remarriage when either the bride or groom (or both) have previously been divorced.



Summer Missions Trip to Chicago



We will once again be serving in Chicago with Sunshine Gospel Ministries (this is where Pete and Nikki Blodgett used to serve) for our summer ministry trip this year. The trip will take place the week of June 30th to July 6th

We will be serving with Bridgebuilders a program within Sunshine's Ministries, this is how they describe their program:

Our Bridgebuilders program is a service-learning program dedicated to hosting teams of high school, college or adult participants for a week or weekend in the Woodlawn neighborhood of Chicago, IL. While the more common moniker of "short-term missions trip" can be accurately applied to our program, it does not capture the depth of our program when used in the traditional sense. Our program is based on a "Listen-Learn-Serve" model and has been influenced by the Chalmers center and the recent book "When Helping Hurts" by Steve Corbett and Brian Fikkert. It is our goal to provide a healthy, sustainable and reciprocal program where participants and locals are mutually empowered. Bridgebuilders places a heavy emphasis on listening to and learning from our community and neighbors as we serve alongside one another. We believe that God has revealed himself in unique ways in low-income, minority-populated, urban contexts like ours and we are very excited to share this with our brothers and sisters in Christ who often come from primarily suburban/rural, middle-class, mostly white areas of our country.

As such, each day we seek to provide participants with an opportunity to listen, learn and serve. Our daily service projects have included (but are not limited to) serving in local churches and ministries, working with youth outreach programs, various construction/demolition projects, community beautification, and serving in local schools. Our daily listening opportunities vary each day but are aimed at exposing participants to different ways in which God is at work in different urban contexts. Examples include visiting Pacific Garden Mission, Lawndale Community Church, and Emmaus Ministries. We also often use a variety of customized experiences such as riding the EL train and having a meal with a homeless person downtown, depending on the week. While we hope that every opportunity given to our participants will also be a learning opportunity, the most formal learning opportunity is in our daily bible lessons whose focus revolves around the biblical discussion of God's justice and mercy, God's heart for the poor, a biblical response to race and class and other similar topics.

We are extremely excited to see how God will use us on this trip and to see how He will use this trip in the lives of our group as well! The cost of the trip will be approximately \$400 for each participant. We would love to have our church family partner with us in prayer and by helping provide funds for those who need assistance. If anyone wants to provide opportunities to help a teen pay for their trip by providing work projects like spring clean-up, lawn mowing, etc, please let Pastor Chad know.



When Steve and Sue were married in 1982 at First Baptist of St Johns, they could never have imagined that God would one day take them to Australia and Asia to multiply church plants and mobilize missionaries. Back then, Sue was feeling fulfilled in her job as an administrative assistant, and Steve was happy to be accepted into the Master of Music program at Michigan State University. Ministry roles in preaching, teaching and administrating could not have been further from their minds.

Sue was born in St. Johns, and born again during evangelistic meetings at Pilgrim United Methodist Church. Just before her freshman year in high school, Sue's parents decided to move the family to First Baptist Church. Through the influence of Jerry Wiedenbenner, the youth pastor at that time, she learned how to study Scripture, pray, evangelize, serve and live biblically. Sue attended Grand Rapids Baptist College, where she received her Associates Degree in Applied Sciences. While singing with the gospel team "Proclamation", Sue met Steve. Sue's heart was softened towards missions during a short-term trip with "Proclamation" to Jamaica. She saw the people's hunger for the Gospel and that opened her eyes to the great need for missionaries.

Grand Rapids was Steve's boyhood home. It was at Trinity Baptist Church that he accepted the Lord, was baptized and discipled. He attended Grand Rapids Baptist College and earned a BMUS degree in vocal performance. Upon accepting employment as a music minister, he continued his education at Grand Rapids Baptist Seminary.

Interest in Australia as a mission field was sparked by a classmate who traveled with "Proclamation" as the team preacher. He was from Melbourne. There were many conversations about Australia while traveling between concerts, and these stuck with Steve and Sue through fourteen years of youth and music ministry in Wisconsin and Michigan. Once they realized God was calling them to be church planters, Australia was the first place they considered. Arriving with their four children in Sydney in 1997, the Mayos set about creating a network of churches that would plant churches. Cornerstone Baptist Church, which opened in February 2000, demonstrated the strength of the Mother-Daughter model. By 2012, the church was self-supporting and called its own pastor. Along the way, 11 other churches were started in Sydney using the same model.

When their church plant graduated, Steve and Sue accepted an expanded role wherein they serve missionaries and national partners in seven countries: Australia, Cambodia, Japan, Mongolia, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, and Thailand. It is their privilege to facilitate the multiplication of churches in some of the most gospel-starved locations on earth. By God's grace, many Buddhists, Hindus, and Muslims across Asia are converting to Christ.

When Steve and Sue are not traveling and ministering in Asia, they are in leadership at two Australian church plants – Calvary meets on Sunday mornings an hour north of Sydney and Logos, a one-year-old plant targeting Muslims near the Mayo's home, has grown quickly to have three Sunday services – the Mayos lead the afternoon one. They also find time for their 13 grandchildren, all of whom are Vegemite-eating, dinky di Aussies.

Kitty was born in Detroit, MI into a Godly family. At the age of seven, during Vacation Bible School, she realized that she was not a Christian just because her parents were. She went forward to become a Christian. At age sixteen she dedicated her life to the Lord. She met Phil at Cedarville College where she received a BA in Elementary Education. Phil and Kitty were married in 1974. Kitty committed herself, in obedience, to serve the Lord in Africa.

Phil was born in Indiana, Pennsylvania. His original home church and parents' commissioning church is Fundamental Baptist in Indiana. He made a profession of faith and was baptized at the age of five. However, he was not at that time truly born again. It was while his family lived and served in the remote town of Bakouma, Central African Republic, that God brought Phil to himself. Almost simultaneously with his salvation, Phil "heard" God's call to serve as a career missionary on the Continent of Africa. His preparation after that was entirely toward that goal. Between 1970 and 1981, Phil received a BA in Pre-seminary Bible from Cedarville College, MRE in Missiology from Grand Rapids Baptist Seminary, and attended the oneyear School of Church Ministries at Calvary Baptist Church in Grand Rapids.

They served in Togo, West Africa for three terms, (1985-1996). God used them to plant two churches and assist with a third. Phil has been the chairman of the missionary field council in Africa which encompassed about forty adult missionaries, a center for the blind and a 24-hour hospital. Kitty's ministry included home schooling their daughters, a significant hospitality ministry in the capitol city of Lomé, and teaching Togolese women. During their furlough in '96 they made a transition to church planting in North American, specifically Chicagoland. They launched the public ministry of Southwest Community Baptist Church in 2000 and have served in nurturing this church plant.

On December 1st, 2010, the Lord opened the way for Phil and Kitty to return to Togo to resume ministry in Africa. This time Phil served as ABWE's regional director for West & Central Africa. With their base country being Togo, they are responsible for the strategic oversight of seven ABWE teams: The Gambia, Cape Verde (islands), Liberia, Ghana, Togo, Benin, and Cameroon.

That ministry is atypical in that the McMillens worked as "player-coaches" meaning that they lived in Africa and participated directly in the church planting work as well as giving encouragement and direction via email, phone and personal visits to ABWE's more than 150 missionaries. They've been involved in front-line church planting in Lomé (the capital and largest city of Togo).


