Calling All Musicians



Prayer Requests - - Submitted to the Church or Shared in Prayer Meeting

When sharing a prayer request about someone outside your family, you need to have the permission of the immediate family in order to share the request. Please remember that a medical diagnosis, a marital struggle, etc., is considered confidential information.

The only exception to this policy would be events that are common public knowledge. For example, if a person has been injured in an automobile accident which has been reported on the news, then praying generally for the person would be ok.

We certainly want to pray for people in need. But we also want to protect the dignity and privacy of those who do not want their needs made public.

Special Needs=Special Opportunities

All throughout Scripture when Jesus was fulfilling His earthly ministry, the people to whom He showed compassion and the people He so perfectly served were those that could offer nothing in return to Jesus. He looked right past appearances, gender, age, societal norms and disability to minister to the hearts of those He touched. He was concerned with the heart of the worshiper, not the act of worship itself. All people should have equal opportunity to know and worship this very Jesus in the world today. No one should be denied access to understanding, knowing and worshipping God. Following Christ's example of love, churches of modernity must also serve the special needs community. Our children's programs from Nursery up to Christ's Cadets are currently serving about 7 children with special needs.

As little ones with special needs get older, the demands and support needed to provide them with the "most encouraging environment to be worshipers of God" becomes greater and requires more servants with hearts to come alongside and support. That's where we need you. Our Junior Church/Christ's Cadets ministry only has just enough hands to serve the children they currently have and the ones with disabilities are in desperate need of "buddies" to assist them in Christ Cadets during the main worship service. The time is right to put together a team of teens and adults that would be willing to be "support buddies" for those we are currently serving and those individuals who are to come. Ideally, the goal would be to have 2- 4 buddies assigned to each child so that each buddy is not missing the worship service on a weekly basis. That may seem like an unattainable number, but this is a large church and God will raise up what is needed.

There will be a special needs family coordinator who will be doing the scheduling, training, behavior plans and providing teaching aides and feedback. The requirements would be that you be 13 or older, have already filled out or fill out the Child Protection Policy, and that you be willing to attend an initial meeting and occasional follow up meetings throughout the year.



When Steve and Sue were married in 1982 at First Baptist of St Johns, they could never have imagined that God would one day take them to Australia and Asia to multiply church plants and mobilize missionaries. Back then, Sue was feeling fulfilled in her job as an administrative assistant, and Steve was happy to be accepted into the Master of Music program at Michigan State University. Ministry roles in preaching, teaching and administrating could not have been further from their minds.

Sue was born in St. Johns, and born again during evangelistic meetings at Pilgrim United Methodist Church. Just before her freshman year in high school, Sue's parents decided to move the family to First Baptist Church. Through the influence of Jerry Wiedenbenner, the youth pastor at that time, she learned how to study Scripture, pray, evangelize, serve and live biblically. Sue attended Grand Rapids Baptist College, where she received her Associates Degree in Applied Sciences. While singing with the gospel team "Proclamation", Sue met Steve. Sue's heart was softened towards missions during a short-term trip with "Proclamation" to Jamaica. She saw the people's hunger for the Gospel and that opened her eyes to the great need for missionaries.


Grand Rapids was Steve's boyhood home. It was at Trinity Baptist Church that he accepted the Lord, was baptized and discipled. He attended Grand Rapids Baptist College and earned a BMus degree in vocal performance. Upon accepting employment as a music minister, he continued his education at Grand Rapids Baptist Seminary.

Interest in Australia as a mission field was sparked by a classmate who traveled with "Proclamation" as the team preacher. He was from Melbourne. There were many conversations about Australia while traveling between concerts, and these stuck with Steve and Sue through fourteen years of youth and music ministry in Wisconsin and Michigan. Once they realized God was calling them to be church planters, Australia was the first place they considered. Arriving with their four children in Sydney in 1997, the Mayos set about creating a network of churches that would plant churches. Cornerstone Baptist Church, which opened in February 2000, demonstrated the strength of the Mother-Daughter model. By 2012, the church was self-supporting and called its own pastor. Along the way, 11 other churches were started in Sydney using the same model.

When their church plant graduated, Steve and Sue accepted an expanded role wherein they serve missionaries and national partners in seven countries: Australia, Cambodia, Japan, Mongolia, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, and Thailand. It is their privilege to facilitate the multiplication of churches in some of the most gospel-starved locations on earth. By God's grace, many Buddhists, Hindus, and Muslims across Asia are converting to Christ. In 2016, five new churches were planted in Cambodia, Japan, Papua New Guinea, and Thailand. The Asia Biblical Theological Seminary moved into a new campus hub in Chiang Mai while increasing enrollment to a record level, and new missionaries were appointed to Australia and Cambodia.

When Steve and Sue are not traveling and ministering in Asia, they lead a church plant north of Sydney that has about 20 people attending so far. They also find time for their 10 grandchildren, all of whom are Vegemite-eating, dinky di Aussies.

Food for Thought...A Challenge to be Thinking Christians



Discontentment Says Something about You, Not our Circumstances

Grumble, Grumble

In Exodus 15, the Israelites camped by the springs of Elim for several weeks, lingering under the palm trees and taking long drinks of cool water. Then it was time to move on. They were on a spiritual journey—a pilgrimage that reveals the pattern of the Christian life.

The spiritual geography of Israel's exodus from Egypt can be mapped onto the experience of our own souls. Although there are times of refreshing, usually they do not last for long. Soon it is time to head back into the desert, which is a place of testing and spiritual growth.

The Israelites headed deeper into the wilderness. Soon they were tired and hungry, and once again they started to complain. Whining was Israel's besetting sin. It started when Moses first went to Pharaoh and people complained that he was making their job harder instead of easier (Ex. 5:21). They grumbled at the Red Sea, where they accused Moses of bringing them out into the desert to die. The grumbling continued more or less for 40 years, as they became a nation of malcontents.

Discontent With God

Our own complaints are not caused by our outward circumstances; rather, they reveal the inward condition of our hearts. Really, the Israelites had nothing to complain about. They were *not* running out of food, but were confusing what they *wanted* with what they *needed*. This is often the source of our discontent: thinking that our "greeds" are really our needs.

The Israelites also exaggerated the advantages of their former situation. "Remember the good old days?" They said. Looking back with longing on their time in Egypt, they imagined themselves bellying up to Pharaoh's buffet. Yet it is doubtful that, as slaves, they were ever treated so lavishly.

Israel's attitude is a warning against the great sin of complaining. Although they complained to Moses, they were really grumbling against God. By saying that it would have been better for God to let them die back in Egypt, they were really saying that they wished they had never been saved.

We need to be honest about the fact that all of our dissatisfaction is discontent with God. Usually we take out our frustrations on someone else. But God knows that when we grumble, we are finding fault with him. A complaining spirit indicates a problem in our relationship with God.

The irony, of course, is that God always gives us exactly what we need. For the Israelites, this meant manna in the wilderness. For us it means the true Bread of Life, Jesus Christ.

He has written or edited more than 40 books, including the popular title *Loving the Way Jesus Loves*, and has lectured and preached at universities and seminaries worldwide.
