# “BY THE WAY, WHAT IS OUR POLICY ON.....”

## FUNERALS

Funerals are a sensitive and difficult time for the families involved. As a church we want to show compassion and concern for those who have lost a loved one. Whether it is a close or distant relative, there is always a sense of loss and separation.

At the same time, due to the size of our church, we realize that there are limits that have to be placed on the use of our facility and the energies of our people. After much thought and prayer, the pastoral staff and deacons drew up the following guidelines for funerals and funeral dinners. We realize that no policy is perfect and that from time to time it may cause a misunderstanding. We hope that publishing these guidelines will at least help families to know the policy prior to the stressful time that inevitably surrounds a death.

**FUNERALS:** Funerals may be conducted in our church building only when the deceased person has been a member or regular attendee of our church. We would consider an exception only in the following circumstances:

1. If the funeral of a fellow believer from another church is anticipated to be larger than their facility will accommodate, we will consider allowing the family to use our building. The deceased person must have been a member or regular attendee of his or her church, and the church must have the same doctrinal stand as our church. The pastoral staff must approve each request.

2. If longtime members of First Baptist Church retire and move to another part of the state or country, and they desire, upon their death, to have their funeral back at First Baptist Church, we will consider the request. The pastor or pastors conducting the funeral, if not a current pastor of FBC, must be in agreement with the doctrinal stand of our church. The pastoral staff must approve each request.

**FUNERAL LUNCHEONS:** Funeral luncheons will be provided by the church following the funeral if the deceased person was a member or regular attendee of our church or if the deceased person was the spouse of a member or regular attendee. The church will be responsible for providing food, and adequate number of workers, and the set up and take down of the tables and chairs.

CSM is an organization dedicated to inner-city ministry. They partner with existing local churches and ministries to provide a unique opportunity for teens to minister and serve the Lord. Working at different ministry locations every day, our group will have an opportunity to learn about unique ministry that they might be able to serve in for the rest of their lives.

This is the first year that CSM has been working in Detroit. In fact, we will be their first group! They reached out to us and asked us to help them pilot their program because of our reputation as a solid youth ministry. While this is a great honor, it is also a big responsibility, as we will have an opportunity to help them build a solid foundation for fruitful ministry. Terry was born and raised in central Michigan and grew up attending a Lutheran Church. However, he was not saved until he was 40. Terry accepted the Lord in St. Johns in September of 1979. He was instructed and then baptized by Pastor Peter Nieuwkoop in 1980.

Inge is a native of Germany and met Terry while he was stationed in Kitzingen am Main. Terry and Inge were married and moved to the States in 1960. Inge dedicated her life to the Lord in 1982 in her home.

When Terry first became a Christian, he wondered how he could serve the Lord as a law-enforcement officer. In 1984, Terry began his term of service as Clinton County Sheriff. He was introduced to Forgotten Man Ministries and eventually took the training course they offered to jail workers. Three months after leaving office, he applied to the Ingham County Sheriff for the position of Chaplain in the Ingham County Jail and, in affiliation with Forgotten Man Ministries, became their first full-time Chaplain where he served from 1993 through the end of 2009.


Following a brief retirement, Terry was recalled to be Chaplain at Eaton County Jail part-time in December 2010 and at Ingham County Jail part-time in February 2011.

Terry retired December 31, 2013 after 20 years in full and part time service in jail ministry. As a commissioned Chaplain, Terry is available to step in for assistance calls from either Ingham or Eaton County Jail Ministries.

There are many thousands of Bible lessons given out and graded each year through the ministry as well as thousands of Daily Bread devotionals and Bibles distributed. Pray for the salvation of inmates and their families. Many lives have been changed both inside and outside of the jail. Pray for those who have made salvation decisions at the jail to find a good church home when they are released that will accept them and disciple them in the Word.



## Food for Thought...A Challenge to be Thinking Christians



### Children Are Not Looking for Perfect Parents BY JOEL BEEKE

Joel R. Beeke is a pastor and theologian. He is pastor of the Heritage Netherlands Reformed Congregation in Grand Rapids, Michigan, and President of Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary

Though children learn from what we say, they learn even more from who we are and what we do. Our faith, our praying, our teaching, and our living must be parts of a seamless whole. Thus, the implementation of our teaching as parent-prophets necessitates godly modeling.

The preeminent godly model for us as parent-prophets is the Lord Jesus, who excelled all others as a true prophet, teacher, fisher of men, and maker of disciples. We do well to make a personal study of the Gospels with an eye to how Christ went about training His disciples. A good teacher looks for good models and constantly strives to hone his skills and improve his methods. Christ provides us with the very best model and abundant resources to draw upon as we take up the work of teaching and training our children.

Children are not looking for perfect parents, and they are remarkably forgiving. They have an uncanny way of knowing who their parents are and what they stand for. It is hard to keep secrets from anyone when we live under the same roof. Children are always reading the books of our lives. Besides the Bible, the way we live our faith from day to day is the most important book our children will ever read.

What children need to see is not a perfect mom or dad, and certainly not a mom or dad who never says, "I'm sorry." They need to see in us an unwavering commitment to Jesus Christ, an unconditional love for them, and a strong bond of love for each other as husband and wife. They need to see a mom and dad laboring shoulder to shoulder, of whom the children can say: "My mom and dad hate sin, they love God, and their only hope is in Christ Jesus. They want with all that is within them to live holy and godly lives. I can see it, I can feel it; I know it is true and it is real, and I want to be like them. I want the God of my father and mother to be my God." In particular, godly modeling should instill in our children the conviction that the Christian life is the way to live and that it brings true joy, true purpose, and true meaning in life, and awaken in them a kind of holy jealousy to want these things for themselves. As our children read the books of our lives, they learn how important God, Christ, the Bible, faith, prayer, and family worship are to us.


