

Sunday, September 28th Sunday School, AM & PM Services



Answers in Genesis (AIG) is known for the Creation Museum near Cincinnati and their life-changing apologetics seminars with Ken Ham and others. A new program enables churches to take advantage of an Answers in Genesis conference at an affordable cost. On Sunday, September 28th, our church will host Answers in Genesis speaker Bob Gillespie for a seminar in our Sunday School hour, as well as our AM and PM services. The Sunday School hour will be for everyone from 1st grade through adults.

The Goals of an AIG Seminar are two-fold:

1. to give believers confidence in believing the historical accounts found in Genesis by showing that science actually confirms what the Bible says and contradicts man's ideas;
2. to explain why we are seeing the collapse of Christian America and are losing 2/3 of our young people, and what the church must do to reach a younger generation.

Bob and Lois Gillespie spent the first 25 years of their married life in Northeast Ohio near their home church, Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, Smithville. They have 2 grown children, David and Gina. Bob and Lois taught in Christian schools in Ohio for 14 years. Through missions conferences at their church and because of their experiences in teaching, the Lord led them to teach missionary kids in West Africa. In 2001, they moved to Bouaké, Cote d'Ivoire, to teach at International Christian Academy (ICA). After the November 2004 evacuation from and subsequent closing of ICA, God redirected their ministry to Sahel Academy in Niamey, Niger, where they ministered for three years. In 2009, God redirected the Gillespies to continue their ministry of Training the Next Generation in the states through Worldview Discipleship Ministries, and ultimately with Answers in Genesis.

“BY THE WAY, WHAT IS OUR POLICY ON.....”

CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY FOR FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

At our Deacons Meeting on August 15th, 2013 the pastors/elders and deacons voted to approve a new Conflict of Interest Policy. While the new policy will, over the years, only apply to a few people in our congregation, it is a model policy that has been highly recommended by Christian legal associations and other churches. It ensures that every matter of church business is conducted in an above board manner with no appearance of any unethical behavior.

A conflict of interest occurs when someone in church leadership or their family member(s) appear to gain an unfair advantage in the way that the church business is conducted. For example, let's suppose that one of the deacons has a son whose business is roofing and siding and he has placed a bid on a roofing and siding job the church is having done. If it is the deacons' responsibility to award the project the deacon whose son has placed the bid should voluntarily remove himself from all discussions about the awarding of the bid and especially from the final vote. His inclusion in the discussions or final vote could appear to be a conflict of interest. The removal of the deacon from the discussion and vote will be duly noted in the official deacon minutes.

Another example: let's suppose that one of the pastors, elders, deacons or missions committee members has a son or daughter who is heading to the mission field and is being considered for financial support from our church. The pastor, elder, deacon or missions committee member in question should voluntarily remove himself/herself from all discussions and subsequent votes on their son or daughter. That would include the missions committee meetings, deacons meetings and the final congregational vote. Again, the voluntary removal of the person will be noted in the missions committee meeting minutes and the deacons meeting minutes.

If you would like a copy of the formal policy you can obtain one from the church office. Also, a book on this subject that is highly recommended by the General Association of Regular Baptist Churches is *Doing Right While Doing Good* by Kevin Vanderground and Kenneth Bickel.



She went on a missions trip to Mexico when she was 16 and told the Lord, "Whatever you want me to do I'll do." She came home thanking the Lord for all she had experienced. The following school year she met Brian. They were married in 1983.

Brian felt the Lord's call into ministry at a Home Missions Conference in Chicago in 1992. He told Sherri of his desires but she didn't want to think of moving. In 1992 Brian asked her about being a missionary with Awana and, eventually, God spoke to her heart (Jan 1994) and brought to mind Mexico and her promise. They submitted their application with Awana. The Lord opened the doors in Awana Clubs International in South Central Michigan, so Brian and Sherri didn't have to move far. They oversee more than 75 churches that have the Awana program.
